Alliance:

Armada Nowlit – Deric Orton, Marc Ma Round table introductions were held.

The delegates were in to introduce the Total Solutions for Gas Treatment and Grid Balancing, leveraging Data Empowerment to Contribute to the Green Economy by Armada Nowlit. They aim to become the leading solution provider to convert underutilized energy to power data centres. Armada Nowlit is a new group emerging into the area. They have obtained approval for its acquisition of natural gas assets located at Hoole Plant in Wabasca and are expected to supply the power of 50MW data centre.

They have staff to people to operate wells and pipelines and can also train local people who want to learn to operate generators and equipment. They have course levels 1, 2 and 3. They have two goals: 1) Create and acquire producing gas wells and 2) Supply agreements associated with crypto mines. The plan is to build a 200MW data centre. The final goal is to build a 1GW of power generation.

Armada Nowlit is eager to be part of the community. They are here to be open and be a responsible player for the local community.

**Luxury First Hotel –** Yolalia Cruel, Jason de Champlain– KIK Transport Manager, Ian Kallay Round table introductions were held.

The delegates were in to talk about the Traffic Bylaw the MD of Opportunity has in place. Yolalia spoke about the impact it has on the Luxury First Hotel business.

Jason would like to continue supporting the business. They rent a room for KIK Transport employees. He said that they wouldn't park loaded trucks and parking would be limited to 1.5 hours, maximum is 2 hours. This would give them time to grab a coffee, have a shower, and have lunch.

They are requesting that the MD of Opportunity come up with a workable solution.
