WHEREAS, Section 150 of the *Municipal Government Act*, RSA 2000, c-M-26, as amended (the *Municipal Government Act*"), provides that the chief elected official of a municipal district is to be appointed by Council from among the councillors unless the council passes a bylaw providing that the official is to be elected by a vote of the electors of the municipality;

**WHEREAS**, the Council of the Municipal District of Opportunity No. 17 previously passed Bylaw 98 – 04 providing that the chief elected official is to be elected by a vote of the electors of the Municipal District of Opportunity No. -04 providing

**WHEREAS**, the Council of the Municipal District of Opportunity No. 17 now deems it appropriate to pass a bylaw rescinding Bylaw 98 – 04 and confirming that the chief elected official of the Municipal District of Opportunity is to be appointed by Council from among the Councillors;

#### Procedure to File a Petition:

- -A petition under this section for a vote of the electors on a proposed bylaw required to be advertised by another Part of this Act or another enactment is not sufficient unless it is filed with the chief administrative officer within 60 days after the last date on which the proposed bylaw is advertised.
- N A petition must be signed by the required number of petitioners. In the case of a municipality, other than a summer village, by electors of the municipality equal in number to at least 10% of the population.

- The petition must include, for each petitioner,
